excited	more excited	the most excited

IRREGULAR ADJECTIVES:

Positive	Comparative	Superlative
good	better	the best
bad	worse	the worst
many/much	more	the most
little	less	the least
*far	farther/further	the farthest/furthest
**old	older/elder	the oldest/eldest

^{*}far – farther – the farthest (when we mean distance)

e.g. It's farther than I thought.

far – further – the furthest (when we mean distance + something different)

e.g. I don't need any further instructions.

e.g. My best friend is **older** than yours.

old – elder – the eldest (when we mean a member of family)

e.g. This is my **elder** sister.

^{**}old - older - the oldest



POPULAR CONSTRUCTIONS WITH ADJECTIVES:

1) (not) as ... as

She is **not** as clever as my best friend.

Your living room is as big as mine.

2) than + comparative

It's later than I thought.

This film is more interesting than the previous one.

3) superlative

It was the most exciting performance I have ever seen.

He is **the most intelligent** person **in** our team.

She is **the nicest of** all my relatives.

4) more and more

It's more and more difficult for me to work here.

It's getting darker and darker.

5) **The ... the ...**

The more you learn, the less you know.
